

Accessibility

Definition

Accessibility of data is the degree to which the user is able to access and use [data](#).

Notes

- Accessibility involves ensuring that data is stored in a format that is compatible with the tools and applications that will be used to work with it.
- Accessibility also includes ensuring that appropriate permissions and security protocols are in place to control who has access to the data.

Relations

- Accessibility is a [characteristic](#) of [data](#).
- Accessibility is preceded by [findability](#). You have to be able to find the data first, to know if they are accessible.
- Accessibility is one of the three aspects of data security: [confidentiality](#), [integrity](#), and accessibility (CIA).
