

Accessibility

Definition

Accessibility of data is the degree to which the user is able to access and use [data](#).

Notes

- Accessibility involves ensuring that data is stored in a format that is compatible with the tools and applications that will be used to work with it.
- Accessibility also includes ensuring that appropriate permissions and security protocols are in place to control who has access to the data.

Relations

Accessibility	is a characteristic of	data
Accessibility	is preceded by	findability
Accessibility	is one of the three aspects of	data security

- You have to be able to find the data first, to know if they are accessible.
- Other aspects of data security are [confidentiality](#) and [integrity](#) (CIA).
