Definitions

- Completeness of [data values](#) is the degree to which all required [data values](#) are present.

Furthermore

- Completeness of [data elements](#) is the degree to which all required [data elements](#) in the [dataset](#) are present.
- Completeness of [data records](#) is the degree to which all required [data records](#) in the [dataset](#) are present.
- Completeness of [data files](#) is the degree to which all required [data files](#) in a [dataset](#) are present.
- Completeness of [metadata](#) is the degree to which [metadata](#) is fully described.
