

Completeness

Definitions

- Completeness of **data values** is the degree to which all required **data values** are present.

Furthermore

- Completeness of **data elements** is the degree to which all required **data elements** in the **dataset** are present.
- Completeness of **data records** is the degree to which all required **data records** in the **dataset** are present.
- Completeness of **data files** is the degree to which all required **data files** in a **dataset** are present.
- Completeness of **metadata** is the degree to which **metadata** is fully described.

Note(s)

- Missing values is a term used to indicate that data values are not complete.
